





FEAST OF CANDLEMAS

The Catholic Church sure knows how to celebrate its feasts! Forty days after Christmas, the Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas. The name "Candlemas" is aptly named, as on this feast, Mass begins with a candlelit procession, all the candles in the church are lit, and candles are blessed. Why the big production? First, it marks 40 days since Christmas, and celebrates Mary and Joseph presenting Jesus in the Temple. Secondly, candles are such a major part of Catholic worship! The use of candles symbolizes the light of Christ. In a time when there was no electricity, candles or oil lights were necessary to see, especially in dark churches. Today, candles mark special occasions; Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, birthdays and romantic dinners all accompanied with the glow of a candle. More importantly, candles remind us that like the wax that gives of itself so that there may be light, so, too, every Christian who bears witness to the world, does the same. Accompanying this feast is the feast of Saint Blaise. The next day, on February 3rd, the feast of Saint Blaise, throats are blessed. This blessing is accompanied with use of candles. As the feast of Saint Blaise falls on a Monday this year, there will be a communal blessing of throats at the 9:00AM Mass.



The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, or Candlemas, will be celebrated on Sunday, February 2nd at all Masses. You are invited to bring your own candles to be blessed at Mass so you may then use them at home.

Dear Padre,

A religious community invited me to become a lay associate. What kind of commitment is needed?

When laypeople and ordained ministers are attracted to the *charism* of a religious order (its distinctive ministry, mission, and spirituality), they're often invited by its vowed members to participate as "associates" in their prayer life, community dynamics, and apostolic works. After a period of formation, associates may make degrees of commitment, with varying expectations on those who profess a formal commitment. Associates may



also be given a distinctive sign of their membership to wear during prayer and ministry.

While associates like the Third Order (tertiaries) have partnered with Franciscans, Dominicans, and Carmelites for centuries, other congregations are only now nurturing new forms of collaboration. Usually, this partnership is mutually transformative for the associates and for those in consecrated life: "The

participation of the laity often brings unexpected and rich insights into certain aspects of the charism, leading to a more spiritual interpretation of it and helping to draw from it directions for new activities in the apostolate" (Apostolic Exhortation on Consecrated Life [Vita Consecrata], 55).

Partnerships between religious communities and their associates are growing in number, based not on utility or diminished numbers of religious today, but on shared faith and responsibility to our universal baptismal call. May the Holy Spirit guide you as you discern this special invitation to holiness!
